**SYNOPSIS —**

On the October 21, 1996, Council agenda is a roll call to:

1. Approve the appointment of Mark Bates, 1509 16th Street, as a representative to the Enterprise Community Steering Committee from the Mondamin Presidential Association. Dr. Bates is replacing Archie Wyman who resigned from the Steering Committee.
2. Accept the resignations of Reva Henry, representing the New Vision Neighborhood Association, Dinh Van Lo, representing the Des Moines Public Schools, and Doris Dabo, serving as the at-large neighborhood representative, from the Enterprise Steering Committee.
3. Approve the removal of Max Johnson, representing the Des Moines Development Corporation, from the Enterprise Community Steering Committee.

**RECOMMENDATION —**

Approve the appointment of Mark Bates to replace Archie Wyman from the Mondamin Presidential Association to the Enterprise Community Steering Committee. Accept the resignations of Reva Henry, Dinh Van Lo, and Doris Dabo from the Enterprise Community Steering Committee. Approve the removal of Max Johnson from the Enterprise Community Steering Committee.

**BACKGROUND —**

On March 27, 1995, by Roll Call No. 95-1178, the City Council established composition of the Enterprise Community Steering Committee, which includes 25 members from the community and agencies that serve the community.

On September 5, 1996, the Enterprise Community Steering Committee received a letter of resignation from Archie Wyman, 1542 16th Street, and a communication from the Mondamin Presidential Association recommending Mark Bates, 1509 16th Street, as his replacement. The Enterprise Community Steering Committee approved a motion to recommend to the City Council that Mark Bates, 1509 16th Street, be appointed as the representative of the Mondamin Presidential Association to the Enterprise Community Steering Committee.

The Enterprise Community Steering Committee has received communications from Reva Henry, representing the New Vision Neighborhood Association, Dinh Van Lo, representing the Des Moines Public Schools, and Doris Dabo, serving as the at-large neighborhood representative, resigning their positions on the Steering Committee. Max Johnson, who represents the Des Moines Development Corporation, has verbally requested to be removed from the Enterprise Community Steering Committee. Mr. Johnson and the Des Moines Development Corporation were contacted and asked to send a letter of resignation to the Chair. No letter has been received.
