RECOMMENDATION –

Approval of the form of contract and use of \$200,000 in **City HOME funds for the project.**

BACKGROUND -

On April 21, 1997, the Des Moines City Council conditionally committed \$200,000 in City HOME funds to the Oakridge Neighborhood for the rehabilitation of 97 units. The \$1,137,149 project proposes using \$200,000 of City HOME Rental Rehabilitation dollars, \$600,000 of State HOME dollars, \$250,000 of Greater Des Moines Housing Trust Fund monies, and \$87,149 of Federal Home Loan Bank funds.

There is a significant need for the rehabilitation of these units. Most of the flooring, counter tops, and kitchen and bathroom cabinets are original equipment. This project (because of the HOME fund involvement) will be affordable to low-/moderateincome tenants for a minimum of ten years.

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
