BACKGROUND -

Highlights of report:

The PLDM raised \$700,000 in supplemental funds that were added to our Fiscal Year 1997-98 operating expenditures.

2 percent increase in annual circulation of library books and media.

2.5 percent increase in registered library customers.

5.4 percent increase in customer visits to libraries.

44 percent increase in use of public-access PCs in libraries.

40 percent increase in access to the PLDM web site.

20 percent increase in attendance at library programs (12 percent increase in children's attendance).

2.5 percent decrease in number of library materials added.

Completion of Customer Service and Information Accuracy benchmark study. Analysis just received to be shared with Library Board and staff (report to Council to follow).

Facilities Needs Assessment data gathering complete, draft report being compiled for Board and committee review.

Increased partnerships with Community and Adult Education, Human Resources Coordinating Board, Metropolitan Transit Authority, Des Moines Art Center, and the Des Moines Civic Center.
