CITY ENGINEER **RECOMMENDATION -**Approval of this agreement with IDOT. **BACKGROUND** -On June 16, 1997, by Roll Call No. 97-2034, Council

> authorized the submittal of a proposal to IDOT for Traffic Safety Funds for traffic signal upgrading on

University Avenue at 19th Street and M.L. King, Jr. Parkway. Subsequently, IDOT reviewed this application and determined that the proposed project would be eligible for Traffic Safety Funds. The City will design the project and provide construction administration.

The construction cost is estimated to be \$80,000, which is 100 percent reimbursable with IDOT Traffic Safety Funds up to a maximum of \$80,000. In-house design and inspection costs, estimated to be \$8,000, will be funded by the City from the Capital Improvements Program.

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
