At their March 16, 1999 meeting, the Traffic Safety Committee reviewed this issue. Staff recommended that Beaver Avenue be eliminated as a truck route between Douglas Avenue and the North City Limits. Several businesses that currently utilize Beaver Avenue for their trucks requested that the removal of Beaver Avenue as a city truck route be delayed until the construction is complete at the Merle Hay and I-35/80 interchange. The Committee voted to deny staff's recommendation and that the item should be revisited when the I-35/80 interchange at Merle Hay Road is complete.

If Council wishes to eliminate Beaver Avenue as a truck route now, the following modification to the Municipal Code is necessary:

SEC. 27-1503. BEAVER AVENUE.
