## **RECOMMENDATION -**

Approval of roll call authorizing a \$50,000 loan and approving loan documents.

## **BACKGROUND** -

Burton Powley of Des Moines, Iowa, has had a long and successful career in skating. He's been a national champion, international competitor, rink owner, director of choreography for a large touring company, teacher, coach, and judge.

He proposes a skating complex specifically catering to figure skating, teaching and coaching, and family recreational iceskating. Figure skating is one of the fastest growing sports in the country, and currently enjoys high television ratings and media visibility. Ice rinks in Iowa have experienced business growth, particularly in recent years. Ice skating customers often travel 20 miles for skating opportunities, which means that much of the golden circle area is a potential market.

This venue will provide additional recreational and entertainment options for a revitalized Gateway East by offering daytime, evening, and weekend skating opportunities.

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
