	BACKGROUND -
	On April 22, 1996, by Roll Call No. 96-1530, Council awarded a contract to Specialty Construction Services, Inc. to make repairs and re-coat the pinniped pool at Blank Park Zoo with epoxy coating.
	Shortly after completion of the project, symptoms of failure of the bonding of the epoxy coating to the substrate of the pool began to appear, including bubbling and peeling of the coatings. The contractor would not cooperate in making the


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necessary repairs to stop further peeling. The contractor only patched what had already peeled. It also became apparent that repairs to the cracks and expansion joints under this contract were failing, as the filler material had lost its bond.

After nearly two years of negotiations with Merchants Bonding Company and the contractor, which included our hiring of third party consultants to determine the ground water level and the cause of the failure of the coatings, the results prompted Merchants Bonding Company to settle the case and make payment to the City in the full amount of the contract.







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
