FISCAL IMPACT -

Cost of travel is \$4,596, \$1,865, \$1,750, \$1,116, and \$2,032, respectively. Funding for these trips is provided for in the 1999-2000 Operating Budget under Index Code ENG070113, page 7-64; Index Code POL011000, page 19-18; Index Code MCC010000, page 16-6 (Daniels and Vlassis); and Index Code FIR040100, page 9-15.

The total expended on City travel from July 1, 1999 through April 3, 2000, is \$297,384.03; the total amount budgeted for City travel is approximately \$370,000.

BACKGROUND -

On January 20, 1992, by Roll Call No. 92-214, the City Council approved a revision to the policy for travel authorization requests. Such revision requires trips that exceed three days and \$1,250 cost to be approved by the Council. The number in parenthesis indicates the total number of trips previously authorized for that individual for the current budget year; R represents resident and NR represents non-resident.
