On January 4, 1999, by Roll Call 99-051, Council authorized the submittal of a proposal to the Des Moines Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) for Surface
Transportation Program Enhancement Funding for landscaping at the intersection of M.L. King Jr. Parkway & S.W. 7th Street. Subsequently IDOT reviewed this application and determined that the proposed project was eligible for Transportation Enhancement Funding.

The proposed landscaping and scenic improvements at the intersection of the new M.L. King Jr. Parkway & S.W. 7th Street intersection will be included in the project for paving of

the new M.L. King Jr. Parkway project from S.W. 2nd Avenue to S.W. 7th Street currently scheduled for bid by IDOT on July 11, 2000.

Federal Transportation Enhancement Funding will be limited to 80 percent of the actual cost of these improvements up to a maximum of \$138,400. The current estimated cost of the intersection enhancements is \$193,566. The cost in excess of the \$138,400, estimated at \$55,166, will be funded from the Capital Improvements Program (CIP) budget for M.L. King Jr. Parkway - East/West Segment.
