On behalf of the City, the Community Development Department is proposing to apply for a Supportive Housing Program grant that includes the HUD geographic areas of the City of Des Moines and Polk County in the amount of \$1,842,103. As the applicant, the City would be responsible for the overall management and administration of the grants, including draw-downs, fund distribution, and reporting to HUD. The City and the three agencies will share 5 percent of

the grant amount for administrative costs.

Project sponsors will carry out the proposed project activities. Project sponsors are:

· Beacon of Life Transitional Housing Project - \$681,860 (new). The Beacon of Life will provide additional support services for homeless adult women, including case management and counseling for substance abuse and mental illness as well as intensive case management for the chronically mentally ill.

- · Buchanan Transitional Living Center Project \$298,175 (renewal). A project of Iowa Homeless Youth Centers will provide two distinct levels of transitional housing opportunities for homeless youth ages 16-21.
- · Lighthouse Transitional Living Project \$862,068 (renewal). A project of Iowa Homeless Youth Centers will provide two distinct levels of transitional housing opportunities for pregnant and/or parenting homeless youth.

The application has been developed from the City's Continuum of Care strategy and will address high priority service gaps within the parameters of SHP-eligible activities.

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
