FISCAL IMPACT -

Cost of travel is \$1,900, \$3,924 (Morano, Feeley and Frisch), \$1,431, \$2,846 (Collins and Moorman), \$2,017 and \$1,035 respectively. Funding for these trips is provided for in the 2000-2001 Operating Budget under Organizational Code ENG070113, page 8-69; Organizational Code ENG070157, page 8-63 (Morano, Feeley, and Frisch); Organizational Code FIR011000, page 10-21; Organizational Code HRS980100, page 12-10 (Collins, Moorman); Organizational Code HRS980100, page 12-10; and Organizational Code CMO010000, page 6-8.

The total expended on City travel from July 1, 2000 through September 21, 2000 is \$89,574.99; the total amount budgeted for City travel is approximately \$346,000.

BACKGROUND -

On January 20, 1992, by Roll Call No. 92-214, the City Council approved a revision to the policy for travel authorization requests. Such revision requires trips that exceed three days and \$1,250 cost to be approved by the Council. The number in parentheses indicates the total number of trips previously authorized for that individual for the current budget year; R represents resident and NR represents non-resident.
