## **BACKGROUND** -

On January 24, 2000, the City of Des Moines 1998 Flood Mitigation Property Buyout Program Grant Agreement was executed by the IEMD approving funds for the purchase of flood-prone properties. This funding is made available through the HMGP which provides for 25 percent of the overall project costs.

Also on January 24, 2000, the City of Des Moines executed a grant with the IDED CDBG program for acquisition, relocation, and demolition of June 1998 flood properties. The IDED CDBG program provides for 75 percent of the overall project costs.

The Flood Buyout program is a voluntary acquisition program, which to date has removed 22 properties from flood prone areas. The original grant included 28 properties; however, five property owners have declined to participate in the program and one acquisition is

pending.

Therefore, in order to fully utilize the funding available in this program, the Engineering Department has re-evaluated the need to purchase flood prone properties and have identified eight other properties that could replace the five which have declined to participate.

Of these, five properties are located along Four-Mile Creek and are in a designated Federal Emergency Management Authority (FEMA) Flood Insurance Rate Mate (FIRM) floodplain. These properties have sustained repeated flooding over the years:

1425 Williams Street 1426 Williams Street 3827 East Jefferson Avenue 1532 East 41st Street 1538 East 41st Street 1539 East 40th Street

The remaining two properties at 4311 Lincoln Avenue and 4213 Leonard Place are located in localized drainageways and have experienced repeated flood damage over the years. Both properties have received financial assistance from FEMA for the June 1998 flood event.

All property owners have been contacted regarding this voluntary program and each has expressed an interest in having the opportunity to participate in the program.

In June 1998 a variety of properties in the City incurred damage due to flash flooding. As a result of this and previous flood events, the City made application to the state and federal governments for

funding assistance to acquire the properties that were damaged. Funding for this project was previously approved on January 24, 2000, under Roll Call Nos. 00-173/174.
