SERVICES DIRECTOR	DMMHA administers an FSS program. Participating individuals work with a coordinator to set and meet goals, such as getting and keeping a full-time job or completing a college education. The Housing Services Department is required to have an FSS program. Currently, the Section 8 FSS program has provided individual case management through Des Moines Area Community College (DMACC), which is working with fewer than the minimum number of participants required. DMACC does not want to take on additional FSS clients because the college is providing its services free of charge.
	FSS provides emotional support and guidance to participating clients, and DMMHA maintains an escrow account on the

participant's behalf.

As part of its SuperNOFA (Notices of Funding Availability), HUD has made funding for an FSS Coordinator available. Funding will cover the salary and fringe benefits for one coordinator for each 50 clients.

This is the first time in several years that housing authorities not already receiving funding for an FSS Coordinator could apply for grant funding.

The funding will help expand the current Section 8 FSS program and give more clients the opportunity to participate in FSS, helping DMMHA meet its mission of providing self-sufficiency to its clients.
