	Iowa, requires the City Council to determine the valuation of each
	lot within the proposed assessment district. A valuation must be the present fair market value of the property with the proposed public
	improvement completed. As an aid in determining valuations, the
	City Council may appoint three persons skilled in the knowledge of
	real estate values within the City to establish the present fair market
	value of each lot within a district and to file a written report of those values with the City Council.
	Chapter 94, Article II, of the Municipal Code of the City
	establishes duties, valuation committee qualifications of members, and fees for services. Section 94-36 stated that individuals shall be
	and rees for services, section 7 + 50 stated that individuals shall be

skilled in the knowledge of real estate values within the City and possess the qualifications that will justify the reception of their testimony in Polk County District Court as experts upon real estate valuations, if necessary. Section 94-32 states that members of the Valuation Committee shall serve as to one or more improvements, or for any length of time not exceeding one year. Any member may be reappointed. Section 94-33 states that the members of the Valuation Committee shall receive compensation at an hourly rate for time actually employed in performing committee duties equivalent to Range 30A, Step 5, of the City salary schedule, which under the current salary schedule is SPM Range 10 Step 8.0 with an hourly rate of \$30.84 effective June 26, 2000.

On March 25, 1996, under Roll Call No. 96-1101; on July 7, 1997, under Roll Call No. 97-2315; on July 13, 1998, under Roll Call No. 98-2161, and on October 4, 1999, under Roll Call No. 99-3148, the City Council approved Professional Services Agreements for Special Assessment Valuation Services between the City and Joseph J. Bell, Jeff Rowat, and L. E. Calvert.

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
