## **BACKGROUND** -

Beckley Imports started in 1979. The business has focused on European cars. The growth of the business will likely come from broadening its service to other makes of cars. With a number of new car dealerships moving their service operations from downtown, there is a market opportunity for service to the broad range of vehicles that are in the downtown area. Mr. Beckley indicates that the new facility will approximately double the present shop size. The new facility will be at 8th and Crocker, and will cost approximately \$1,250,000, including land, building, and equipment.
