	on East 5th and Locust Streets. In 1999, the Community Development Department retained the services of a consultant team
	to prepare a development concept and implementation strategy for the
	block between East 4th and East 5th Streets, between East Grand and East Locust. The consultant team recommended a development
	concept for the block that included the rehabilitation of the existing buildings as well as new infill construction.
	Several financing sources were identified as resources for the

rehabilitation component of the project. Two important sources are the Federal Rehabilitation Tax Credit and the State of Iowa Rehabilitation Tax Credits. In order to utilize these funding sources to the greatest extent possible, however, the buildings or district must be listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

The RFP developed by the Office of Economic Development solicits proposals for two activities. The consultant must first survey the Eastern Gateway to identify the boundaries of a historic district and determine whether the defined district meets the eligibility criteria for a National Register Historic District. If it is determined that the identified district meets the criteria, the consultant will complete the required nomination activities.

The Council will be asked to approve an agreement with the selected consultant at a later date.
