	On June 5, 1989, by Roll Call No. 89-2469, the City of Des Moines
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	revised an original Professional Consulting Services Agreement for
	preparation of an annual Indirect Cost Allocation Plan with David M.
	Griffith (DMG/MAXIMUS). The Professional Consulting Services
	Contract had no termination date. The annual contract payment for
	services was set at \$12,500 and has not changed over the 12-year
	period. During this period, the City requested changes (expansion) of
	services under the contract with DMG/ MAXIMUS which they

agreed to at no additional cost.

DMG/ MAXIMUS is a nationally recognized firm in performing this service and has respective contracts with 94 of the 99 counties in Iowa. DMG/MAXIMUS is intimately familiar with the City's operation and accounting structure.
