	BACKGROUND -
	The Iowa Department of Transportation (IDOT) Commercial Air Service Marketing Program (CASMP) provides funding for marketing, advertising, and public relations programs to improve scheduled air service and increase passenger traffic at Iowa's

commercial service airports. Annually, the Transportation Commission establishes the amount of funds to be allocated to each commercial service airport. Programs funded must be started and completed between July 1st and June 30th of each year. Ordinance No. 12040, which established the Airport Board, provides that the City Council must approve and accept all state or federal grants.
