	Last spring, a child was attacked and mauled by an aggressive dog while it was running at large. The child was hospitalized for five days
	and needed over 200 stitches to his leg to close the injuries caused by
	the dog. The dog was declared dangerous, and officials within the
	Police Department felt that this animal should have been destroyed because of the severe injuries it caused to the child. Unfortunately,
	the Municipal Code did not allow that option, and the animal was
	relocated to another community.
	Modifying the Code to require destruction of an animal in cases

where the animal has inflected severe injuries is prudent and will prevent citizens in other communities from having to be put at risk of injury.
