DIRECTOR	completion of the Resource Center Master Plan and signage throughout the park. The plan for the Resource Center area includes a
	marine rental facility, restrooms, concession stand, observation deck,
	plaza, parking lot and boat dock and trail. During fundraising, a group of donors led by Oaks Development Corporation and Regency
	Builders expressed support to attempt to have these improvements
	donated through contributions of labor and materials. These efforts
	have significantly completed these improvements, but some work is left and donations have slowed.
	The public's response to Gray's Lake has been extraordinary, and
	there is a high demand for the additional amenities and recreational

space that will be provided in the southwest corner. The bid documents presented will complete this area to a level that will allow building use after December 1, 2001, and use of the plaza and parking lot by May 1, 2002. The trail was previously opened for use in 2000.

The City is very appreciative of the very significant contributions of Regency Builders, Oaks Development Corporation, local contractors and multiple Trade Unions to substantially complete the southwest corner.
