SUBMITTED BY:	The Park and Recreation Department is in the process of finalizing bid documents for the completion of the first four fields at the
DONALD M. TRIPP	Greater Des Moines Softball Park located at NE 46th Street and
PARK AND RECREATION	Broadway. It is anticipated that the bids will be issued after the first of the year with play beginning in the spring of 2003.
DIRECTOR	
	The first component of this development is the need to extend the water main to the site. This portion of the project has been let for
	bid and is being managed by the Des Moines Water Works. It has
	been determined that the City's portion will not exceed \$195,437, below the designer's estimate of \$250,000.
	Upon completion of the water main extension, the Des Moines Water Works will submit a final bill to be paid by the City for its portion of the completed work. Des Moines Water Works

anticipates the total cost to the City to be approximately \$177,670. A 10 percent contingency has been added to accommodate any change orders that may occur due to unforeseen circumstances in the field.

Once completed, the Greater Des Moines Softball Park will host local league games and allow the City to bid for regional tournaments. The completion of the first four fields will include four lighted tournament quality fields, irrigation, dugouts, restroom/concession facility, walkways, parking, and a maintenance facility.

When the complex opens in 2003, Ashfield, Chesterfield, and Hawthorne North and South Softball Fields will be converted back into neighborhood parks and be taken out of regularly scheduled softball games and practices.
