	The FAA is responsible for regulating aviation security in the United States. A part of aviation security, as established and
	onited states. A part of aviation security, as established and

regulated by the FAA, the City of Des Moines, as owner and operator of the Des Moines International Airport, is required to provide certain security items and to perform certain security functions. These requirements include providing local law enforcement officers at the Airport to assist in fulfilling required security functions. For many years, these required law enforcement functions at the Airport have been provided at Aviation Department expense by the Des Moines Police Department. With the FAA requirement for more security, additional law enforcement officers from the Des Moines Police Department are now needed so that additional officers can be assigned to the Airport for the foreseeable future.
