	Loading zones are established in the downtown area to serve the
	adjacent business needs, in conjunction with on-street parking, which is usually metered to regulate the usage. By being located on a public
	street, both the parking and the loading zone are available for use on a
	first-come first-served basis and are not reserved for the use of any
	individual business. Generally, there is one loading zone on each side

of the street in each block located to best serve all the businesses in that block.

For this block of East 5th Street between Locust Street and Walnut Street, there are two existing loading zones on the east side of the street. One is located about in the middle of the block and a second loading zone toward the north end of the block in front of the building at 501 E. Locust. This loading zone is located about 20 feet south of the entrance to Contemporary Furniture, where it can serve that business, as well as other businesses south of them.

Because there are currently two loading zones in this block, with one located approximately 20 feet from the building entrance of Contemporary Furniture, no change in these existing loading zones is proposed. At their January 15, 2002 meeting, the Traffic Safety Committee concurred with the staff recommendation on this item.
