Based on City counts taken August 2000, 42nd Street carried approximately 4,700 vehicles per day just south of Grand Avenue. The average speed was 30 mph, with the "85th Percentile" speed at

34 mph. The speed limit is 25 mph. The neighborhood also

commissioned several of their own speed studies. The first, taken in July 2000, indicated an average speed of 36 mph and an 85th percentile speed of 42 mph. The second, taken in August 2001, showed an average of 32 mph and an 85 percent speed of 36 mph.

At a meeting in October 2001, staff met with the neighborhood traffic committee and developed a proposed list of improvements that were recommended for implementation along 42nd Street. Three items were identified as "Phase 1" projects. These are:

- 1. Installation of additional speed limit signing south of Greenwood Drive.
- 2. Installing centerline and edge-line markings between Grand Avenue and Greenwood Drive.
- 3. Installation of a temporary traffic circle at the 42nd/Foster Drive intersection.

Several "Phase 2" projects were also identified that include additional traffic circles. These would be implemented only if additional traffic calming measures are deemed necessary after the first projects are completed. They would also involve additional discussions between staff and the neighborhood association.

Staff concurs that the items in Phase 1 should be implemented and is proceeding with items 1 and 2. Six months to one year after the temporary traffic circle is installed, this circle will be re-evaluated by staff and the neighborhood to determine its effectiveness and whether a permanent traffic circle should be installed. At their February 12, 2002 meeting, the Traffic Safety Committee concurred with the staff recommendations.
