The project will be REDEVELOPMENT phased in as part of the City's Capital Improvement Program. There PLAN is \$1,400,000 in the recently adopted FY 03-08 Capital Improvement Program (CIP). **TYPE: RECOMMENDATION -RESOLUTION** ORDINANCE Approve the redevelopment plan as presented. **RECEIVE/FILE** BACKGROUND -**SUBMITTED BY:** Greenwood Park is one of the first-of-four parcels of land within the City of Des Moines to be designated as a park. Since its inception, DONALD M. TRIPP Greenwood has seen numerous improvements including the Sylvan PARK AND RECREATION Amphitheater, Rose Garden, Mary Miss Environmental Sculpture area, Science Center, Arts Center, Bill Riley Trail and the Ashworth DIRECTOR swimming pool. Over the years, some park elements like Sylvan Amphitheater have fallen into disrepair and/or are rarely used. Walkways and trails have never been fully developed. Traffic patterns in and out of the park have changed. Picnicking and parking facilities are inadequate for such a large park. In the Spring of 2001, the City of Des Moines contracted with a local landscape architect, Brian Clark & Associates, to re-master a plan for Greenwood Park. Following several meetings with focus groups, neighborhood associations, Park and Recreation staff, and the general public, a final master plan has been prepared. Park elements identified for improvement include: several new walkways and trails;

additional parking areas; a large year-round picnic/warming shelter; renovation of Sylvan Amphitheater; uniform signage; relocation of the park maintenance facility; various erosion control measures; and the sale of four lots on the northwest corner of the park property. The Plan has been presented to and/or approved by several City boards:
