The **SUBJECT:** resolution authorizes the Mayor to sign said Agreement. **DOUGLAS HOERR** ARCHITECTURE FISCAL IMPACT -CONTRACT \$100,000 in Capital Improvement Program (CIP) funding (PKS034). RECEIVE/FILE **BACKGROUND** -**SUBMITTED BY:** In February 2001, Janis Ruan, member of the Mayor's Streetscape Task Force, brought noted Chicago landscape architect Douglas Hoerr DONALD M. TRIPP **PARK AND** to Des Moines for lectures on urban landscape design, and the positive RECREATION impact that increasing the green component of the streetscape can **DIRECTOR** have on a city. On April 8, 2002, by Roll Call No. 02-862, the City entered into a three-party agreement with Des Moines Water Works and the Ruan Corporation to bring Doug Hoerr to Des Moines to review existing landscape plans and to see if there was some way to link together the numerous projects in various stages beginning at the Des Moines

guidelines.

Airport and ending at the State Capitol. Initially Mr. Hoerr's contract called for review of the Fleur Drive Master Plan, the streetscape

around the Ruan properties and the 7th Street Parking Garage, and the landscape around City Hall including the parking lot. In addition, Mr. Hoerr prepared recommendations on a prototype set of landscape

Mr. Hoerr fulfilled the terms of this initial contract in January, 2002. The approvals requested in this document are necessary in order to move forward on one of the projects that was specifically named in Mr. Hoerr's initial contract, namely the landscaping of City Hall, and to continue the consulting relationship in order to insure that there is a consistency in design throughout the Gateway and Fleur Drive corridor.

A subcommittee of the Task Force consisting of Bill Dikis, Janis Ruan, Jim Grant, and Don Tripp was created in February 2002 in order to work on the Landscape Guidelines. Staff presented a draft version of the Des Moines Landscape Guidelines to the subcommittee on April 11th.

Of the \$100,000 requested, \$50,000 covers Phase II of City Hall landscaping. Specifically these funds will be used for additional design development, the production of construction documents and bid administration. Of the remaining \$50,000, \$40,000 covers the consulting portion of the contract that will enable Doug Hoerr to provide input on a series of current and future projects; thereby, ensuring that a consistency in landscape design occurs throughout the Fleur Drive/Grand Avenue - Locust Street corridor. The remaining \$10,000 covers reimbursable expenses.

Park CIP funds in the amount of \$91,000 are available in Fiscal Year (FY) 2002 from the Ashby Park Wading Pool fund as the approved CIP moved this program, with full funding, to FY2003. An additional \$9,000 will come from the Gateway project budget. Also approved was \$100,000, FY2003 CIP funds for the installation of City Hall landscaping from the design and construction documents that will be prepared by Mr. Hoerr.

On May 6, 2002, by Roll Call No. 02-1203, the City Manager was authorized and directed to negotiate a contract for professional services with the firm, of Douglas Hoerr Landscape Architecture for Phase II landscaping of City Hall and the adjacent parking lot, and for the provision of consulting services for other landscape projects, said contract to be subject to City Council approval after negotiation thereof and execution by Douglas Hoerr Landscape Architecture.

When Mr. Hoerr's work is completed, it will be sent to City Council for review and approval.
