MOULDER CHIEF OF POLICE Previous cases have been made which clearly established that people were transporting prostitutes, were aware that the transportation was needed so that the business of prostitution could be conducted, but officers were finding it nearly impossible to establish that an exchange for something of value had occurred between the transporter and the transportee.

The Police Department's purpose is to have an enforceable ordinance that can be used to help reduce the prostitution business, and ensure that all those involved in seeing that it thrives are held accountable.
