BACKGROUND -

The City Council is requested to set a public hearing for June 17th to consider an agreement with the City of Norwalk in which the established relocated Iowa Highway 5, west of Iowa Highway 28, will be the mutual boundary between the City of Des Moines and the City of Norwalk. This requires the City of Des Moines to sever the property south of Iowa 5 and Norwalk to then annex the severed land. This request is joined by Mr. Frank R. Gillotti on behalf of Road Contractors, a landowner in the area, to sever from the City of Des Moines and annex to the City of Norwalk. The property is represented on the maps attached to the Roll Call as "Territory 1".

The City of Norwalk and United Properties Investment Company, Inc. represented by Mr. Michael A. Coppola is seeking a boundary adjustment of the current Annexation Moratorium agreement so that the property shown on the map attached to the Roll Call as "Territory 2" can be voluntarily annexed into the City of Des Moines.

It should also be noted that the Iowa Department of Transportation, a property owner in the area (Iowa 5) must also sign this document and has indicated they are willing to do so when both affected Cities have signed the agreement.
