DIRECTOR	BACKGROUND -
	Recently, Mayor Daniels was approached by representatives of Laborers Local 177 who volunteered to provide free labor to the City of Des Moines for sidewalk replacement, focusing on areas with a concentration of elderly or low-income residents. Staff recommends using this resource in this year's NIRP neighborhood, King-Irving. Under the program, apprentices from Local 177 will construct replacement sidewalk at designated locations, with Public Works' crews inspecting the sidewalk and removing defective areas.

Beginning the week of June 24, 2002, and lasting throughout the summer, Laborers Local 177 will provide up to a five-person crew for 20 hours a week to frame, pour, and backfill replacement sidewalk.

Public Works' crews will inspect and remove defective sidewalk and provide the materials required by Local 177 to replace the sidewalk. All work completed by the apprentices will be inspected by the Public Works Department for compliance with City code requirements.

The cooperative effort going into this program will help ensure that a maximum amount of defective sidewalk is removed and replaced for the safety and convenience of the residents in the King-Irving neighborhood.
