BACKGROUND -

In June of 1999, the Des Moines Park and Recreation Board established the Citizen Advisory Wading Pool Committee to study and analyze the existing opportunities and constraints of the City of Des Moines' wading pools. On October 24, 2000, after several public meetings, the Park and Recreation Board received and filed the Committee's recommendations. On November 6, 2000, the Des Moines City Council received and filed the same recommendations from the Park and Recreation Board.

One of the wading pool sites that was recommended to continue and be renovated was Ashby Park. A novelty design, essentially a figure

eight with a traditional pool and an added area with water spray fountains, is planned for the site (see Exhibit A attached to the Roll Call). In addition to the new wading pool, the Committee recommended building a new parking lot within the park to replace the existing on-street parking lot. It was felt that the new parking lot would be much safer, especially with an anticipated increase in use of the new wading pool. Subsequent to the Council's receipt of the Committee's recommendations, several citizens from the Ashby neighborhood expressed concerns with regard to the proposed parking lot.
