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The next phase of the implementation of public safety communications improvements will involve the integration of the existing building infrastructure and related mechanical and electrical systems with the new communications equipment and systems. Call No. 02-623, the City Manager and staff were authorized to enter into contract negotiations with Siemens Integrated Local Government

Systems and directed to develop and return an implementation plan to

include a negotiated contract for communications equipment and

communications system to be installed.

On February 8, 2002, the Engineering Department mailed Requests for Proposals (RFPs) to six engineering firms asking for proposals to prepare detailed plans for implementation of the Police Dispatch Center Renovation. On March 4, 2002, proposals were received from Brooks Borg Skiles; Brown Engineering Co.; Pulley & Associates; and Shive Hattery, Inc.

A consultant selection committee composed of City staff from Engineering Design Division, Fire Department, Park and Recreation Department, and Police Department reviewed the proposals. The proposals were rated on experience with similar projects, qualifications of key personnel, understanding of the project overview, references, quality of the proposal, and costs. The selection committee found two firms, Pulley & Associates and Brooks Borg Skiles as being very qualified to do the work required by this project. While both firms had excellent proposals, it is recommended that Pulley & Associates be selected. Pulley & Associates was rated higher utilizing the Consultant Rating Form and showed an in-depth understanding of the project.

It is anticipated that construction on these projects will be completed during 2002 and 2003.
