**BACKGROUND** -

On May 19, 1997, the City Council approved a \$200,000 loan for Raccoon River Brewing Company, L.L.C. for equipping a new restaurant and brew pub at 200 Tenth Street. The City loan was part of a \$1.1 million project. The City loan was funded from tax increment revenues and not by the City's General Fund.

The Raccoon River Brewing Company closed its operation in December 2000. On December 4, 2000, the City Council approved the assumption of the loan and related obligations by Principiant Hotel Company, L.C. who took possession of the brew pub. The original intent of the Principiant Hotel was to find a new, outside operator for the restaurant, which they were unable to do. Consequently, Principiant Hotel, L.C. has invested \$360,000 in improvements and new equipment, hired new management, and reopened the Raccoon River Brew Pub. Construction in the area, relocation of utilities in 10th Street, and the loss of parking in the area is creating severe impacts on the business since it reopened. The requested forbearance will assist in the long-term prospects of the restaurant/brew pub as a viable entity and a destination downtown location.
