	PACIC CROUND
	BACKGROUND -
	On March 15, 1999, by Roll Call No. 99-734, the City Council

authorized the Mayor to establish a Des Moines Public Art/Design Task Force. Since then, the Task Force has been working toward developing a Public Arts Program for the City of Des Moines. This has involved research on Public Arts Programs in other cities and interviews with individuals associated with the programs. The Task

Force also worked with Design Iowa, an initiative of the Iowa Arts Council and their advisors, Bruce Williams, Coordinator of Artists and Public Art Programs for the Iowa Arts Council and Jack Becker, Project Manager for Forecast Public Artworks in St. Paul, Minnesota.

On December 18, 2000, by Roll Call No 00-580, the City Council declared its intent to establish a Public Arts Commission and referred the matter to the City Manager for a recommendation on staffing and budget and to the Legal Department for the preparation of the necessary amendments to the Des Moines Municipal Code.

On October 22, 2001, By Roll Call No. 01-3210, the City Council passed an ordinance adding and enacting Article IX to Chapter 82 establishing a Public Arts Program and a Public Arts Commission.

On March 18, 2002, by Roll Call No. 02-769, the City Council approved the first 15 appointments to the Commission. The Commission has been meeting regularly and has developed a long-range plan and has identified its priority projects for FY 2002-03.
