### SYNOPSIS —

On September 10, 2001, by Roll Call No. 01-2676, City Council approved a consultant agreement for Operational Unit No. 1 modification evaluation at the Dico (Titan) Facility portion of the Martin Luther King, Jr. (MLK) Parkway project with Barker Lemar Engineering Consultants (S. Mike Barker, President, 1300 Cummins Road, Suite 201, Des Moines, Iowa, 50315). Supplemental Agreement No. 1 will provide for preparation of cost estimates for site restoration or development, support the property appraisal process, assist in preparation of documents for the U.S. Department of Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), and attend meetings related to MLK Parkway construction across the Dico portion of the Des Moines Trichloroethylene (TCE) Superfund site.

#### FISCAL IMPACT —

The environmental consulting firm of Barker Lemar Engineering Consultants has agreed to provide services covered by Supplemental Agreement No. 1 for a maximum fee of \$20,000. Funds for this supplemental agreement are provided for in the Capital Improvements Program (MLK Parkway East-West Segment) and shall be eligible for matching dollars under State Revitalize lowa's Sound Economy (RISE) grant.

### **RECOMMENDATION** —

Approval of Supplemental Agreement No. 1 between the City of Des Moines and Barker Lemar Engineering Consultants.

#### BACKGROUND —

On September 10, 2001, by Roll Call No. 01-2676, City Council approved a consultant agreement with Barker Lemar Engineering Consultants for the Operational Unit No. 1 modification evaluation at the Dico Facility in conjunction with the MLK Parkway project. Barker Lemar Engineering Consultants has completed this work, and a supplemental consultant agreement will be required to provide estimates, site status summary, associated meetings, and technical proposal assistance.

In the past, Dico has not been cooperative with the City of Des Moines staff concerning the existing environmental concerns associated with MLK Parkway construction across the Dico portion of the Des Moines TCE Superfund site. This prompted the City to hire Barker Lemar Engineering Consultants to provide analysis of the site necessary for design and property

acquisition. CITY COUNCIL The Dico property was placed on the EPA National Priorities List (NPL) in September 1983. The EPA is the jurisdictional authority for the existing COMMUNICATION environmental concerns on the Dico property. In order to be in compliance, 02-588 **NOVEMBER 18, 2002** the City has to submit, discuss, and receive approval from the EPA before any modifications are made to the current operation of the NPL site. **PAGE TWO** The EPA is familiar with Barker Lemar Engineering Consultants' work associated with the Dico Superfund site, which is necessary for the prospective purchase agreement process. Also, if Dico had settled with the City concerning the property acquisition, the additional consultant services would not have been required. Therefore, Barker Lemar Engineering Consultants were selected for this additional work by the Engineering Department as the best qualified.
