Resolution to Seek Federal Funding in 2005 for Des Moines' Priority Projects

SYNOPSIS—

On the March 7, 2005 Council agenda is a roll call to authorize Council members and City staff to seek Federal funding in 2005 for Des Moines' priority projects. Projects include transportation, recreational enhancements, flood control, redevelopment, GIS and law enforcement. BACKGROUND—

During the past five years, the City of Des Moines has been extremely successful in obtaining more than \$30 million of Federal funding for its priority projects through the authorization, reauthorization and appropriations processes. In 2005, the City will seek Federal funding for the following projects.

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The U.S. House of Representatives is anticipated to take action on all Federal funding requests in spring/summer 2005, and the U.S. Senate to deliberate in fall 2005.

On March 2, 2005, Congressman Boswell announced that the full House Transportation and Infrastructure Committee passed H.R. 3, the TEA-21 Highway Reauthorization Bill. This legislation will provide \$284 billion in Federal funding over the next six years. It is expected to pass the full House during the week of March 7, 2005. Congressman Boswell was successful in obtaining \$7.5 million for the SE Connector/Martin Luther King, Jr. Parkway East, \$6.5 million for Interstate-235 reconstruction and \$4 million for the Riverwalk projects. These funds are significant in revitalizing Des Moines.

It is essential to continue the partnership between the City and our Congressional delegation to seek funding for Des Moines' priority projects.
