# BACKGROUND—

On May 24, 1993, by Roll Call No. 93-2026, the City Council approved the Neighborhood Recognition Policy. This policy sets guidelines for the formal recognition of neighborhood associations by the City. This formal relationship makes it possible for recognized neighborhoods to act as advisor to the City on issues impacting their neighborhoods.

Neighborhood organizations must meet the requirements of the Neighborhood Recognition Policy to become and maintain recognition by the City. This includes submitting a variety of information annually. To facilitate this requirement, the Community Development Department, with the over-site of the Neighborhood Revitalization Board (NRB), conducts an annual survey of the neighborhoods. This year's survey was mailed January 31, 2005 and was due February 25, 2005.

Forty-nine of the fifty Recognized Neighborhoods responded to the survey. No response was received from the Frisbie Park Neighborhood Association. Staff has been in contact with former officers of the group, who indicated that they are no longer interested in being a Recognized Neighborhood. In accordance with the Neighborhood Recognition Policy the NRB voted on May 4, 2005 to forward a recommendation to Council that the City no longer formally recognize the Frisbie Park Neighborhood Association.
