75% - Affordable Housing Endowment Fund

25% - Physical Improvements to existing Manors

RECOMMENDATION—

BACKGROUND—

The Housing Services Department received approval for its application to dispose of 394 Public Housing units at Fair Market Value, via a public bid on August 19, 2003. Where there is a commensurate public benefit, according to federal regulations, sales can be negotiated with a specific buyer.

Anawim Housing and Mercy Housing, Iowa nonprofit corporations have a long history of providing affordable housing in the City of Des Moines, of meeting the requirements of federally funded housing programs and has the ability to meet the requirements of DMMHA's disposition plan. Anawim Housing and Mercy Housing intend to use this property for their affordable rental program for households below 80% of HUD median income guidelines.
