AGENDA HEADING:

Bid No. V07-078, Approving Purchase of One (1) Automated Side-loading Refuse Truck in the Amount of \$199,859 for Use in the Public Works Department.

SYNOPSIS:

On March 12, 2007, by Roll Call No. 07-468, the City Council approved the low dollar compliant bid for four (4) refuse trucks from Peterbilt of Des Moines. One additional refuse truck is now recommended for purchase following an electrical fire in an existing unit. Peterbilt of Des Moines (Brad Wilson, President, 3445 Adventureland Drive, West Des Moines, IA 50009) has agreed to honor its earlier bid price of \$199,859 from Bid V07-078. Staff recommends approval.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

On May 7, 2007, Solid Waste unit #737 was rendered a 100 percent loss due to an electrical fire. Replacement is required to maintain efficiency in automated Solid Waste collection operations. The Public Works Department and Procurement Manager researched available options for replacement and determined that a competitive bid approved for four similar units in March 2007 could be extended to this unit. The matter was brought to the attention of the City Manager who agreed with staff and directed that use of the earlier bid be presented to Council for approval.

The unit being purchased will have a diesel engine with the minimum horsepower and torque necessary to operate the hydraulic packer body. It will also meet the new 2007 clean air emissions standards of a 50 percent reduction in Nitrogen Oxides (NOx) and a 90 percent reduction in Particulate Matter (PM) or soot compared to the unit that is being replaced. The truck will utilize Bio-Diesel fuel to further reduce emissions that impact the environment.

While the performance of hydraulic packer equipment is reliant on horsepower and torque, fuel efficiency in future passenger vehicle purchases will continue to provide opportunities for gaining fuel efficiencies with smaller or hybrid engines and decreases in the size of vehicles.
