AGENDA HEADING:

Purchase of Multi-RAE Plus Wireless Monitors (Iowa CBRNE Detection Grant Program)

SYNOPSIS:

Recommend approval of the purchase of Multi-RAE plus Wireless Monitors (environmental monitoring equipment) from RAE Systems, 3775 North First Street, San Jose, CA 94134 in the amount of \$49,210.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Amount:

The \$49,210 purchase is part of the equipment acquisitions approved in Iowa's Chemical, Biological, Radiological, Nuclear and Explosive (CBRNE) Detection Equipment Program grant budget, which authorized expenditures totaling \$260,000 dollars. Included in this purchase is equipment valued at \$8,185 that will be retained for use by the City of Des Moines/Polk County Metro STAR Team. The remainder will be distributed to other task force teams.

Funding Source:

FY07-08 Operating Budget, SP751, POL985321, page 288. The U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS), Grants and Training (G&T) FFY 2006 Homeland Security Grant Program (HSGP) made an allocation of grant funds to the State of Iowa. Iowa Homeland Security and Emergency Management entered into Sub-grantee Agreement #2006-GE-T6-0065-009 with the City of Des Moines, to administer the Chemical, Biological, Radiological, Nuclear and Explosive (CBRNE) Detection Equipment Program grant.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

The City of Des Moines serves as the fiscal agent and authorized representative for the administration of Iowa's FFY 2006 Homeland Security Grant Program funds on behalf of Iowa's Chemical, Biological, Radiological, Nuclear and Explosive (CBRNE) Detection Equipment Program.

The Multi-RAE Plus Wireless Monitors will be provided to Iowa's (WMD) Tactical Officer's Task Force Program to perform OSHA required environmental monitoring and to maintain interoperability with Iowa's Bomb Squad Task Force Teams, Iowa's Hazardous Materials Task Force Teams, and the Iowa National Guard's 71st Civil Support Team.

The Procurement Administrator and the Police Department determined that RAE Systems is the manufacturer and sole area wide distributor for the identified equipment. Iowa CBRNE Detection Grant Program workgroup completed a capability assessment and investment justification for FFY 2006

Homeland Security Grant Program funding, based on the National Preparedness Goal, federal Target Capabilities List, and the Iowa Strategy for Homeland Security and Emergency Management 2006-2008. The Multi-RAE Plus Wireless Monitors are part of the acquisitions approved for purchase by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security Grants and Training, and Iowa Homeland Security and Emergency Management, which are consistent with the federal Approved Equipment List (AEL).

The City of Des Moines/Polk County Metro STAR Team will receive one (1) Multi-RAE Plus Wireless Monitor and the remaining five (5) Multi-RAE Plus Wireless Monitors will be provided to the other task force members.
