AGENDA HEADING:

Approving schematic design for the John and Mary Pappajohn Sculpture Park

SYNOPSIS:

Recommend approval of the schematic design for the John and Mary Pappajohn Sculpture Park. The schematic design is attached to the roll call.

FISCAL IMPACT:

<u>Amount</u>: Total project cost of the Sculpture Park, estimated at \$4 million, will be privately funded through a combination of donations and grants. The City's total contribution would be \$501,000.

<u>Funding Source</u>: Recommended 2008-2009 Capital Improvements Program, Park Improvements Page-17, Pappajohn Sculpture Garden, PKS169, TIF transferred from the original Western Gateway Redevelopment Project - URR027

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

In February 2007, the City of Des Moines and the Des Moines Art Center announced that Des Moines philanthropists John and Mary Pappajohn would be donating major pieces of sculpture to the Art Center for placement in Western Gateway Park, located between 10th and 15th Streets and Grand and Locust Streets in downtown Des Moines. The Pappajohns' donation offers Des Moines the opportunity to showcase one of the most significant collections of art in the United States. To best showcase the art and address important issues of security and maintenance, it is necessary to make alterations to the current design of the park. The architectural design firms of Agrest and Gandelsonas, with the support of several local sub consultants including RDG, have been working with the City and the Art Center to create a schematic design for Western Gateway Park.

There has been significant opportunity for input on the proposed sculpture park. In addition to direct input from the Pappajohns, meetings have been held with stakeholders that assisted in the development of the original Western Gateway Park. The schematic plan has also been presented and reviewed by the Urban Design Review Board, Planning and Zoning, and Park and Recreation Board. There is a separate item on the March 24, 2008 Council agenda for the approval of professional services with Agrest and Gandelsonas Architects, LLP for design development.

Portions of the Western Gateway Park will be modified for placement of the sculptures and funding for these changes will be raised privately. However, there will be some funding from the City. Currently

\$500,000 remains from bonds previously sold for Western Gateway Park and these will be transferred to this sculpture park project. City funds will be used for the consultant services and other soft costs. The construction of the project will be funded through a combination of donations and grants. An overall project budget of \$4 million has been established.
