AGENDA HEADING:

Purchase of Remotec Digital Radio Control Systems for Iowa's (EOD) Bomb Squad Task Force Program

SYNOPSIS:

Recommend approval of the purchase of the Digital Radio Control System upgrades from Northrop Grumman – Remotec, Inc. in the amount of \$424,314.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Amount: \$424,314

This purchase is part of the equipment acquisitions approved in Iowa's (EOD) Bomb Squad Task Force budget, which authorized expenditures totaling \$480,000. Included in this purchase is one (1) digital radio control system upgrade valued at \$53,039.25 to be retained by the City of Des Moines Bomb Squad. The seven (7) remaining digital radio system upgrades will be distributed to the other task force teams.

<u>Funding Source</u>: FY07-08 Operating Budget, SP751, POL985303, page 288. The U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS), Grants and Training (G&T) FFY 2007 Homeland Security Grant Program (HSGP) made an allocation of grant funds to the State of Iowa. Iowa Homeland Security and Emergency Management entered into Sub-grantee Agreement #2007-GE-T7-0032-014 with the City of Des Moines, to administer Iowa's (EOD) Bomb Squad Task Force Program grant.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

The City of Des Moines serves as the fiscal agent and authorized representative for the administration of Iowa's FFY 2007 Homeland Security Grant Program funds on behalf of Iowa's (EOD) Bomb Squad Task Force Program.

The Northrop Grumman - Remotec Digital Radio Control System upgrades represent the latest radio control system technology available for use with the Northrop Grumman - Remotec Andros F6A Multi-function Robotics Platforms deployed by all members of Iowa's Bomb Squad Task Force Program.

The Procurement Administrator of the Finance Department has determined there is only one vendor that can provide the needed equipment. The digital radio control system upgrades for the Andros F6A Robots are only available from Northrop Grumman – Remotec, Inc. 353 JD Yarnell Industrial Parkway, Clinton, Tennessee 37716, who is the manufacturer and sole world-wide distributor for the Andros F6A robotics platform, parts and radio control systems.

Iowa's (EOD) Bomb Squad Task Force Program Leadership Committee completed a capability assessment and investment justification for FFY 2007 Homeland Security Grant Program funding, based on the National Preparedness Goal, Federal Target Capabilities List, National Strategy for U.S. Bomb Squads and the Iowa Strategy for Homeland Security and Emergency Management 2006-2008. The digital radio system upgrades were approved for purchase by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security Grants and Training, and Iowa Homeland Security and Emergency Management Division, which are consistent with the requirements of the federal Approved Equipment List (AEL).
