AGENDA HEADING:

Open/Close Public Hearing on the Adoption of the Third Amendment to the SE AgriBusiness Urban Renewal Plan.

SYNOPSIS:

Request for Council to open/close the public hearing and to approve the Third Amendment to the SE AgriBusiness Urban Renewal Plan.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Amount: \$8 million

<u>Funding Source:</u> The estimated costs related to the acquisition, construction and equipping of the fire logistics and training facility are about \$8 million and shall be financed by up to \$8 million from available TIF revenue funds and other revenues such as general obligation-backed bond proceeds and various state and federal grants.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

The urban renewal plan and tax increment designation were approved for this area in 1998. The amendment provides for:

- updating the urban renewal plan language and maps since its last amendment in 2002.
- designating an acquisition parcel on Dean Avenue for a City fire logistics and training facility
- providing for additional public safety uses, such as the fire training facility, to be financed with tax increment revenues including expenditures of up to \$8 million for the new facility.
- amending the termination date of the plan from its current date of December 31, 2018 to that date by which financial obligations secured by the urban renewal plan are completed and/or a later date the Council may select.
- revising the report on tax increment revenues and expenditures.

Tax Increment Report: The SE AgriBusiness Urban Renewal Area was concurrently designated a tax increment area in January 1998. The "frozen" tax base was about \$48 million; since then, there has been an additional \$35 million in new tax base generated (or about \$1.36M in TIF revenues annually). The City currently uses about \$1M of that revenue to pay off bonds (issued for land acquisition and infrastructure installation) which will be retired in late 2008.

The proposed fire logistics project is estimated to cost about \$8 million for property acquisition and construction of the facility. The new facility has classrooms and other areas required for training DM Fire Department personnel as well as enclosed areas for maintenance, supply warehouse and distribution operations. The major classroom and supporting break rooms will be laid out and equipped so they can be converted for use as the City's Emergency Operations Center (EOC) when necessary.

Administration space, restroom/shower/locker facilities, kitchen, dining areas and support areas will be shared. There will be an apparatus parking-indoor skills area for year-round training and temporary storage of apparatus designated for maintenance.

Exterior elements will provide the required infrastructure for structural fire suppressing training and drills, driver's training, pump training and testing, hazardous materials, special operations, and other specialized rescue services training and exercises.

Purchase of property and construction of the fire operations facility which will be subject to specific Council approvals.

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
