# **AGENDA HEADING:**

Approving Downtown Des Moines Self-Supported Municipal Improvement District (SSMID) Operating Agreement.

## **SYNOPSIS:**

Recommend approval of an agreement to engage the Downtown Des Moines Self-Supported Municipal Improvement District to operate, manage and undertake SSMID services, improvements and activities intended to enhance the vitality of the downtown area. The term of the agreement is July 1, 2009 to June 30, 2014.

# ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

This agreement extends a relationship which began in February, 1998 and extended in 2001 and 2005. The SSMID was created according to Iowa Code as a means to collect a special Operations Tax from downtown property owners to support a higher level of services within its boundaries. The City Council adopted an ordinance on February 23, 2009, providing for the continuation of the Operations Fund and the collection of the Operations Tax. The Operations Tax is limited by the ordinance to a rate of \$2.00 per thousand dollars of taxable value, although the tax rate has not exceeded \$1.00 in past years. Enhanced services provided include:

- Enhanced maintenance and cleaning of public spaces
- Services to enhance the safety of persons and property, including a "Goodwill Ambassador" program
- Development and management of activities for marketing, business retention and attraction,
- Capital or physical improvements
- Improvement of the skywalk system, including maintenance, cleaning, and security

The agreement requires that the SSMID subcontract with the Downtown Community Alliance to employ a full-time Director to supervise the management and operation and perform all administrative duties of the SSMID; subcontract with Greater Des Moines Partnership to perform SSMID's financial and

fiduciary duties; and provide "clean and safe" services and activities as currently performed by Blockby-Block.
