# **AGENDA HEADING:**

Award of Bid No. V10-033, Fall Tree Plantings.

## SYNOPSIS:

The Purchasing Department issued bids to 13 qualified vendors and received seven responses. Recommend approval to award contract to lowest bidder for tree plantings to TNT Landscaping, John Church, Owner, 131 S.W. Ordnance Road, Ankeny, IA 50023.

## FISCAL IMPACT:

### **ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:**

The urban forest in the City of Des Moines is a significant public asset providing shade and character throughout the City. Currently, the urban forest within the City consists mostly of aging mature native tree species. As the City Department responsible for the care and stewardship of a significant portion of the City's urban forest, the Des Moines Park and Recreation Department is undertaking a long-term reforestation effort to ensure the future of the urban forest.

In 2005, the Des Moines Park and Recreation Department contracted with the Iowa Department of Natural Resources (IDNR) to complete a forestry study for the six largest City parks. Those parks were Ewing, MacRae, Greenwood, Grandview, Pioneer and Union. This study conducted a tree assessment of each park and completed a reforestation plan recommending tree locations and species.

In 2006, the reforestation plan was put into action by the planting of 330 trees in Union Park, 387 trees in Grandview Park, 132 trees in Greenwood Park and 158 in Pioneer Park. In 2007, the reforestation effort continued with the fall planting of 205 trees in MacRae Park and 155 trees in Ewing Park, which completed the six parks outlined in the study. In 2008, an effort was made to expand the reforestation effort into all of the parks with a fall planting of 330 trees in a total of 24 Parks, 3 Cemeteries and 1 Community Center.

To continue the reforestation effort for all City parks, a bid proposal for the fall planting of 660 trees in a total of 20 Parks, 4 Cemeteries, 4 Athletic Facilities and along 2 Recreational Trails. Park and

Recreation Department anticipates the removal of over 150 trees next year due to capital improvement projects in parks and along trails and noting that the fall tree plantings count towards the Tree Removal and Mitigation Ordinance requirements. The fall planting bid was sent to 13 landscape contractors. Of the 13 bids mailed, the City received a total of 7 bids. Based upon number of trees, species of trees and logistics involved in installation at each park, the Park and Recreation Department recommends awarding the bid based on the lowest, completed bid tab. This recommendation is as follows:

660 Tree Planting award to TNT Landscaping, John Church, Owner, 131 S.W. Ordnance Road, Ankeny, IA 50023, as low bidder for \$90,442.
