AGENDA HEADING:

Approval of First Amendment to the Supplemental 28E Agreement between the Neighborhood Finance Corporation (NFC) and the City of Des Moines.

SYNOPSIS:

Request Council approval of an amendment to the Supplemental 28E Agreement between the City of Des Moines and NFC to reflect the actual expenditures of \$1,237,687 used to fund the 2008 Flood Voluntary Acquisition program for Birdland and Four Mile residents. The amendment reduces the amount of funds to be repaid to NFC by \$262,313, and revises the repayment schedule to the NFC, as outlined in the Amended Supplemental 28E Agreement by and between the NFC and the City of Des Moines.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Amount: \$262,313 reduction in obligation to the NFC

Funding Source: G.O. Bonds, CMO990000, FY2008-09 CIP, Page 19, Economic Development.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

On July 28, 2008, by Roll Call No. 08-1376, the City Council approved a funding agreement for one million dollars with the NFC to fund the 2008 Flood Voluntary Acquisition program for the Birdland area, and authorized the voluntary acquisition of eligible properties. NFC realized the 2008 flood had an overwhelming impact on some households in the flood devastated areas.

NFC receives funds from the City of Des Moines and Polk County each year through a 28E agreement. Throughout the years, NFC used the funds in accordance with 28E guidelines. Furthermore, through prudent underwriting, seeking repayment on loans, and recovery of portions of forgivable loans that did not fulfill the NFC's requirements, NFC minimized losses of the funds from the City and County. Due to this vigilant stewardship of the funds, NFC was able to provide financial assistance to the City and County for flood relief efforts, and partner with the City, County and other not-for-profits to facilitate service delivery.

On September 8, 2008, by Roll Call No. 08-1625, the City Council approved an amendment to and an extension of the 28E Agreement by and among Polk County and NFC until June 2012, an amendment to the Birdland Buy-out Program Funding Agreement between the City of Des Moines and NFC to fund

acquisition costs of additional properties in the Birdland area, and approval to proceed with acquisition of additional eligible flood-damaged properties in the Four Mile area.

On October 13, 2008, by Roll Call No. 08-1806, the City Council approved a Supplemental 28E Agreement to fund the five additional eligible properties (two in Birdland and three in Four Mile) through borrowing an additional \$500,000 from the NFC, but setting up terms of repayment. The terms of the repayment outlined in the agreement required the City to provide an additional \$166,667 to NFC each year for the years June 30, 2010 through 2012.

The buy-out program is complete with a total of 14 owner occupied homes purchased in the Birdland and Four Mile areas for a total project cost of \$1,237,687. The original budget for this project was \$1,500,000, which was funded by NFC with a \$1,000,000 grant and a \$500,000 loan. The actual project costs were \$262,313 less than budgeted, which was a result of lower than expected costs for demolition, relocation and administrative activities.

The First Amendment to the Supplemental 28E agreement has been revised to reflect the actual amount spent and the repayment terms have been modified to the following:
