AGENDA HEADING:

Ordering construction of the following: Harriet Street Boat Ramp Repair - Receiving bids, (3-9-10), and Setting date of hearing, (3-22-10). (Construction Estimate - \$93,300).

SYNOPSIS:

Recommend the City Council proceed with construction of the improvement and set dates to receive bids and hold a public hearing, as required by Iowa Code, utilizing the method of financing referenced below. This project provides for the reconstruction of the Harriet Street Boat Ramp that was damaged during the floods of 2008.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Amount: \$93,300 City Engineer's Estimate

Funding Source: Storm Mitigation/Recovery, OPR178, Being: Anticipate 100% FEMA reimbursement under FEMA Disaster 1763, Project PW3526.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

The Engineering Department has prepared plans, specifications, form of contract documents and City Engineer’s estimate for the construction of the Harriet Street Boat Ramp Repair, 11-2009-015. The improvement includes dewatering sheet piling, concrete removal, reinforced concrete boat ramp, Class ‘B’ Revetment, Class 10 Channel Excavation, Class 10 Borrow Excavation, Granular Backfill and Mobilization in accordance with the contract documents, including Plan Files 516-072/075 at the Harriet Street Boat Ramp, East of S.E. 14th Street at the Des Moines River, Des Moines, IA.

The estimated construction cost is \$93,300. The proposed plans, specifications and form of contract documents are available for public inspection in the City Engineer’s Office.
