AGENDA HEADING:

Ordering construction of the following: 2010 Tennis Court Resurfacing - Receiving bids, (4-13-10), and Setting date of hearing, (4-26-10). (Construction Estimate - \$95,428).

SYNOPSIS:

Recommend the City Council proceed with construction of the improvement and set dates to receive bids and hold a public hearing, as required by Iowa Code, utilizing the method of financing referenced below. This project provides for resurfacing to provide a new playing surface of twelve tennis courts at Waveland Park and five tennis courts at Birdland Park. This project will not begin until river levels have receded.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Amount: \$95,428 City Engineer's Estimate

Funding Source: 2010-2011 CIP, Page Park-13, Neighborhood Park Improvements, PKS137, G. O. Bonds.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

The Engineering Department has prepared plans, specifications, form of contract documents and City Engineer's estimate for the construction of the 2010 Tennis Court Resurfacing, 11-2010-013. The improvement includes construction on tennis court facilities located at Waveland Park and Birdland Park in Des Moines, Iowa, including crack repairs, joint sealing and joint repairs, court resurfacing, and finish color and striping on 17 tennis courts; in accordance with the contract documents, including Plan File Numbers 517-019/027.

The estimated construction cost is \$95,428. The proposed plans, specifications and form of contract documents are available for public inspection in the City Engineer's Office.
