ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

On September 22, 2008, by Roll Call No. 08-1660, the City Council approved the 2008 Continuum of Care application and authorized and directed the City Manager to submit the application to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. Included in the application was the YMCA Permanent Housing Program. This is a bonus program under the Samaritan Housing Initiative and will provide permanent supportive housing for up to 30 chronically homeless men. A Case Manager experienced in working with persons experiencing homelessness, mental illness and substance abuse will provide support services. The YMCA has over 50 years of experience in providing housing and support services to homeless men in Des Moines. They currently serve 187 eligible homeless residents and will continue the services after they move the resident program to a new location on SW 9th St. The bonus funding is for a three year period and can be renewed annually after that.
