AGENDA HEADING:

Directing the sale of Series 2010D and E General Obligation (G.O.) Bonds for the FY2010-11 Capital Improvement Budget and approving Preliminary Offering Statement.

SYNOPSIS:

Recommend approval of the sale of two series of G.O. Bonds to finance \$27,230,000 in acquisition and construction projects as part of the FY2010-11 Capital Improvement Budget.

- Series 2010D is \$25,330,000 with a 20-year term, federal tax exempt, to be repaid from the debt levy and tax increment proceeds
- Series 2010E is \$2,260,000 with a 5-year term, taxable, to be repaid from the debt levy and tax increment proceeds

Issuance costs are estimated to be \$360,000.

FISCAL IMPACT:

<u>Amount:</u> \$27,590,000, made up of \$27,230,000 project costs and \$360,000 issuance expenses.

Funding Source: Fiscal Year 2010-11 Operating Budget:

- Property Tax Debt Service Levy Debt Service Fund DS001 FIN900100, Page 116.
- Tax Increment Fund Special Revenue Fund SP370 FIN909105, Page 117.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

Public hearings were held with no public comment received. City staff reviewed projects that anticipated the availability of non-city funding to determine the certainty of those funds. Only two projects have uncommitted non-city funding.

Matching Funding Status

First Tee (\$650,000 county and private)

City staff continues to pursue these funding sources but does not yet have commitments in writing. Staff recommends the City proceed with the \$325,000 bond issuance. These proceeds will not be spent while the non-city funding is pursued. If the \$650,000 cannot be firmed up, the First Tee Project will be

abandoned, the Bright Foundation grant will be returned, the bond proceeds will be redirected to other capital projects scheduled for FY12 and the FY12 bond sale will be reduced accordingly.

Beaver Avenue Streetscape (\$850,000 private)

Virtually no matching funds have been raised for this project to date. City staff will continue to work with the neighborhood association to raise the \$850,000 share to match the City's \$1,110,000 bonding scheduled for the project. These proceeds will not be spent while the non-city funding is pursued. If the \$850,000 cannot be raised, the initial \$260,000 of the City's overall \$1,110,000 bonding plan will be redirected to other capital projects scheduled for FY12 and the FY12 bond sale will be reduced accordingly.

Additional Adjustments

Des Moines received additional grant funding for three projects that will allow for a reallocation of bonds to meet additional needs that have developed since the adoption of the CIP in February. Staff recommends the following reallocations occur within the legal constraints of the public hearings held on April 26th and May 10th.

Bond Reductions (due to additional grant funding)

- Fire Maintenance/Logistics Facility: \$3,000,000 tif-backed bonding
- SE Connector SE 6th to SE 14th: \$500,000 tif-backed bonding
- East Indianola Widening: \$500,000 levy backed bonding

Bond Increases (due to project funding need):

- SE 6th Widening: \$600,000 tif-backed bonding
- Mulberry Street Construction 13th to 16th: \$1,265,000 tif backed bonding
- Energy Building Monitoring System: \$110,000 levy backed bonding
- Economic Development Land Acquisition MLK/MLK Extension Corridor: \$1,635,000 tif backed bonding
- Street Resurfacing: \$390,000 levy backed bonding

The net impact of these actions will not change the amount of G.O. bonding included in the adopted CIP.
