AGENDA HEADING:

Hearing on 2010 Expanded Street Resurfacing Program - Contract 2: Resolution approving plans, specifications, form of contract documents, engineer’s estimate, receive and file bids, and designating lowest responsible bidder as OMG Midwest, Inc. d/b/a Des Moines Asphalt & Paving, James Gauger, President, \$1,686,417.47.

SYNOPSIS:

This is a public hearing to allow for public input on the 2010 Expanded Street Resurfacing Program - Contract 2 and take the necessary actions as required by Iowa Code to authorize a contract for construction of the proposed project. This project provides for full depth patching, scarification of existing asphalt streets, and hot mix asphalt (HMA) overlay of residential streets citywide. The project addresses citizen concerns regarding the condition of city streets by preserving deteriorating infrastructure. The City of Des Moines has received \$867,784 in I-JOBS Local Street & Road Funding that will finance part of this project.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Amount: \$1,686,417.47 Construction Contract (\$1,950,000 City Engineer's Estimate)

Funding Source: 2010-2011 CIP, Page Street-47, Special City-wide Street Improvements, STR217, Being: \$867,784 in I-JOBS Local Street & Road Funding (\$630,532.64 in Rebuild Iowa Infrastructure Fund per House File 822 and \$237,251.23 in ARRA Block Grant per House File 820) and \$818,633.47 in Gaming Monies from the Agreement with Polk County and The Racing Association of Central Iowa

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

I-Jobs is an \$830 million, three-year initiative of the Culver/Judge Administration intended to create jobs, strengthen the state’s economy and invest in Iowa’s infrastructure. As part of this initiative, the 2009 General Assembly appropriated to the Iowa Department of Transportation (IDOT) \$39,450,000 from the rebuild Iowa Infrastructure Fund (House File 822) and \$5,550,000 from funding designated for government stabilization under the federal Recovery Act block grant (House File 820). The IDOT will deposit 50% of these funds into the Street Construction Fund of the Cities and 50% into the Secondary Road Fund of the Counties for formula distribution to the cities and counties. Local funding will be distributed over Fiscal Year 2010 and 2011.

The City of Des Moines has received its 2010 allocation of \$867,784 in I-JOBS Local Street & Road

Funding (\$630,532.64 in Rebuild Iowa Infrastructure Fund per House File 822 and \$237,251.23 in ARRA Block Grant per House File 820). These funds must be used for construction, repair, or maintenance of city streets before June 30, 2011.

On July 12, 2010, under Roll Call No. 10-1117, the City Council received and filed plans, specifications, form of contract documents, and City Engineer's estimate for the construction of the 2010 Expanded Street Resurfacing Program - Contract 2. Before the City Council can enter into a contract, it must hold a public hearing and approve the proposed plans, specifications, and form of contract documents and engineer's estimate for the construction of the 2010 Expanded Street Resurfacing Program - Contract 2, 06-2010-016. The improvement includes scarification of existing asphalt streets, furnish and place hot mix asphalt, and furnish and place pavement markings, and other incidental items; in accordance with the contract documents, including Plan File Nos. 522-165/186, at the following locations in Des Moines, Iowa:

- E. 6th Street from Buchanan Avenue to E. University Avenue
- E. 9th Street from E. Grand Avenue to Lyon Street
- S.W. 9th Street from 100' North of Olinda Avenue to Creston Avenue
- S.W. 9th Street from Thornton Avenue to Watrous Avenue
- Bloomfield Road from Highway 65/69 to HMA East of Highway 65/69
- Delaware Avenue from Easton Boulevard to Guthrie Avenue
- Delaware Avenue from E. Hull Avenue to E. Euclid Avenue
- Des Moines Street from E. 1st Street to E. 4th Street
- Des Moines Street from E. 6th Street to E. 9th Street
- Forest Avenue from 19th Street to M.L. King Jr. Parkway
- Guthrie Avenue from E. 23rd Street to Hubbell Avenue
- Ingersoll Avenue from 15th Street to 17th Street
- McKinley Avenue from S.W. 9th Street to S.W. 10th Street
- University Avenue (curb) from 9th Street to 15th Street
- University Avenue from 42nd Street to 48th Street
- E. University Avenue from East of E. 9th Street to York Street.

Sealed bids for said improvement were submitted by the following bidders:

OMG Midwest, Inc. d/b/a Des Moines Asphalt & Paving, Des Moines, IA
Grimes Asphalt & Paving Corp., Grimes, IA

The bids were received and opened at a public meeting presided over by the City Engineer in the City Council Chambers, 2nd Floor, City Hall, 400 Robert D. Ray Drive, Des Moines, Iowa at 11:00 a.m. on July 27, 2010.

The City Engineer has determined that the lowest responsive, responsible bid for the construction of said improvement was submitted by OMG Midwest, Inc. d/b/a Des Moines Asphalt & Paving, James Gauger, President, 5550 NE 22nd Street, P.O. Box 3365, Des Moines, IA, 50316-0365 in the amount of \$1,686,417.47, and said bid should be accepted. The Finance Director has determined that funds are available for said improvement as stated above.
